

R. Berecz called the Byron Council Meeting to order on May 11, 2009, with the pledge to the American and Michigan flags at 7:40 p.m..

Members Present: Hulett, Richardson, Cole, Musall, D. Berecz, & Hulett.

Members Absent: Boillat-Wilcox.

Visitors: Sergeant Wilburn, M. Granger, D. Thompson, D & B. Schmidt, D. & L. Root, Jeremy Root, Jennifer Root, K. Hulett, E. Bailey, M. Prestonise, T. Gilbert, L. Keith, K. Quillan.

The minutes were read and approved.

Hulett made the motion to pay the bills totaling \$4,206.87 and the bills paid out through the month totaling \$16,235.23. Seconded by Cole. Roll Call Vote. All Ayes No Nays. Motion Carried.

The Treasurer's Report was read by Helen Hulett: P. Care-61,983.10, Water-216,135.49, Sewer-794,685.54, L.S.-211,354.90, M.S.-117,125.94, General-100,421.43, Cemetery 8,854.85. TOTAL \$1,510,561.25.

The Police Report was reviewed and Musall made the motion to accept the verification of hours worked for March of 273.95 hours. Seconded by Hulett. All Ayes No Nays. Motion Carried.

Ken Quillan from Insituform Technologies was present to inform the council of a way to seal underground sewer lines with a jointless, seamless, pipe within a pipe process. It is one continuous pipe from manhole to manhole. The council will look at his demonstration after the council meeting.

The Zoning Ordinance was presented to the council from the Planning Commission and R. Berecz stated that the Village Attorney is reviewing the ordinance and the council decided to wait until we hear back from the attorney for his approval.

M. Granger wanted the council to have the police officers enforce the "No Parking Signs" at the sewer road. The Council stated that if the signs are there the police could enforce it. Granger didn't want to be responsible for the towing bill if he called a wrecker. The attorney will be called to see if the village is liable if a semi or any other vehicle is parked next to the sewer road. There were also other complaints about people parking too close to intersections and not being able to see. R. Berecz asked people to call the police department if they see something that could be a hazard and also to get a license plate number, and then it can be documented and followed up with.

Mr. Thompson was present to tell us that the Memorial Day Parade will be at 1:00 with the line-up at the elementary school at 12:30.

Jennifer Root wanted to know whatever became of the Recycling Survey? R. Berecz stated that it would cost the village an additional \$4,000. a year and the budget wouldn't allow it.

Libby Bailey from the school child care wanted permission to visit the DPW building on June 24th at 1:00 and the Police Department on August 12th at 1:00 and possibly set up a time to visit the Cemetery. She would have approximately 10-15 children with adult supervision. The council had no objections.

Leo Keith requested a copy of the police report. He complained about fires in the village today and it's not a burn day. Also he complained about parked cars on the street and near intersections. R. Berecz again stated the best way to prevent this is to call the police department and make your request known or call central dispatch and an officer will take care of the problem.

D. Richardson wanted to know when the burn pile could be burned in the cemetery. Hulett stated he will get with the DPW employees tomorrow. Richardson said he has been picking up all of the plastic flowers and putting them in the dumpster.

D. Berecz requested a 90-day raise for Officer Brandon Miller from \$7.75 to \$8.75 retroactive back to 4/17/09 per Chief Sampey. Musall so moved and Hulett Seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote. All Ayes No Nays. Motion Carried.

The Clerk reported that she had faxed the cemetery contract and insurance forms to our insurance company to be sure everything was in order. The Clerk reported that our insurance company stated that an individual business can not get Worker's Compensation on a minor, when our insurance company audits our employees we would be charged for workers comp for a minor because the state protects minors. T & G Lawn Care stated that they would be willing to pay the premium. The council was not willing to take on the liability. Musall stated if they are unable to fulfill the contract we will hire the next contractor.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:35.
