

R. Berezcz called the Byron Council Meeting to order on September 10, 2007 with the pledge to the American and Michigan flags at 7:35.

Members Present: Hulett, Morse, Cole, Musali, Berezcz, & Hulett.

Members Absent: Boillat-Wilcox.

Visitors: G. Palmer, Chief Sampey, L. Keith, B. Green, E. Krejci, K. Ayotte, C. Wilcox-Brewer, D. Markley, K. Hulett, R. Peckins, A. Alger, D. Richardson, and S. Granger.

The minutes were read and approved.

Hulett made the motion to pay the bills totaling \$69,569.44 and the bills paid out through the month totaling \$18,466.38. Seconded by Musall. Roll Call Vote. All Ayes No Nays. Motion Carried.

The Treasurer's Report was read by Helen Hulett: P. Care-62,909.12, Water-210,950.03, Sewer-737,234.34, L.S.-174,356.18, M.S.-97,471.48, General-133,928.32. TOTAL \$1,416,849.47.

The Police Report was reviewed and Hulett made the motion to accept the verification of hours worked for August of 317.9 hours. Seconded by Musall. All Ayes No Nays. Motion Carried.

Gary Palmer stated that there is a proposed development for a mini storage unit for 119 N. Saginaw Street. There is not a zoning ordinance that covers storage units so there will have to be a meeting set up in the next couple of weeks with the zoning board of appeals to review the use of the property.

Chief Sampey stated they had completed the bike safety program with the boy scouts, they had participated in the Cruising for a Cure, and the officers had completed the Taser training except for one officer. The police hours were higher due to the 28 hours of Taser training. He also stated to keep watching the web sight they are continually updating the sight. There is an area for "Report a Crime" anyone can put any information on there without leaving a name and it has been very helpful.

Brian Green was present to see about getting access to two lots on East Street, block 87 4 & 5. It is a platted road, but it is just grass at the present time. The road would need to be 33' x 100'. He presented graphs for expenses and incomes to the Village. He stated he would just like a letter stating that if the buyer purchases the property, has house plans and has a building permit then the Village would put in a road. Gary Palmer stated that the ordinance states all build able lots have to have access on a public street. R. Musall made the motion to table this until the next meeting after receiving a letter from Tom Bridges. No support, motion died. Berezcz stated lets not table this for another month, she made the motion to contact Tom Bridges and if it would benefit the Village that we get a statement from him and the President can call a special meeting for their approval. The letter would state that the road would be put in after plans have been submitted, a building permit issued and the road would be put in within 14 days. Seconded by Hulett. All Ayes No Nays. Motion Carried.

Ken Ayotte stated that he would appreciate the zoning board of appeals to meet as soon as possible so the sell of his property wont be delayed any longer than need be.

Denise Markley wanted to thank the council for the help in the Cruise for a Cure and especially thank Chief Sampey for all of his involvement and for making the cruise a safe and professional ride.

Berezcz reported that the water monitoring equipment is in, but no date has been set to install them. He also stated that 3 sections of sidewalk had been put in by the DPW.

Hulett had two bids for a pine tree in the cemetery, two maple trees and 7 stumps to be removed: Miles House \$900. and Ronald's Tree Service \$955. Berezcz made the motion to have Miles House do the above work. Seconded by Musall. Roll Call Vote. All Ayes No Nays. Motion carried.

Berez acting as Secretary/Treasurer of the Fire Works Committee asked for permission to close Maple Ave. from Saginaw St. to the elementary school on September 22nd from 9-3:00 p.m. for the car show. The council had no objections.

Green presented new contracts from Campbell, Kusterer for the Village audit for 2008, 2009, & 2010 for \$3,200. per year. Berez so moved and Hulett seconded the above proposal. Roll Call Vote. All Ayes No Nays. Motion Carried.
